

FINESTONE PARK REDEVELOPMENT

Public Engagement Summary

September 2018

Background

Finestone Park is located at 160 Kurt Ave., between Finestone Street and Kurt Avenue. The Finestone Park play structure was removed in 2003 after it reached the end of its serviceable life. The City of Winnipeg (the City) plans to redevelop Finestone Park and is asking for your feedback to find out what you want in the park to better serve park users and the surrounding community.

In early 2018, community members gathered signatures to redevelop Finestone Park and provided their petition to Councillor Pagtakhan. The City is considering redevelopment of Finestone Park to add amenities to better serve the community and asked the public for input. The park currently has a grassy area, with a few benches, trees, shrubs, and a garbage can. Potential amenities explored during public engagement included a play structure, a splashpad, picnic tables, trees, and benches.

Promotion

The public workshop and online survey were promoted using the following methods:

- City of Winnipeg website;
- Letter from Councillor Pagtakhan mailed to 460 households – May 14, 2018;
- Facebook posts May 17 to June 11;
- Twitter posts May 17 to June 11;

- News release May 17, 2018; and
- City of Winnipeg public engagement newsletter emailed to over 5,000 recipients on May 25 and June 7, 2018.

Engagement

A public workshop was held May 31, 2018 at Garden Grove School and was attended by over 25 community members. At the workshop, participants discussed the existing outdoor recreation and park amenities available in the Tyndall Park neighbourhood, while considering which amenities are overused, underused, or are currently unavailable. Following this discussion, participants provided suggestions on park enhancements that would better serve park users and the surrounding community and indicated their individual preference for amenities using dots to represent their votes (see Appendix B for full results).

A survey was available on the project website from May 17 to June 14, 2018 to gather additional input on the Finestone Park Redevelopment. The survey was completed by 24 participants online and by 7 participants at the workshop (31 total).

Engagement Results

Workshop and survey participants expressed multiple views on amenities that could be added to Finestone Park. Although there was some difference of opinion on several of the proposed amenities, there was consistency in feedback with regards to adding a path and some type of amenity for children. Notes about participants:

- A range of ages participated, including 4 who were under 18, 6 from 18-34, 11 from 35-55, and 5 who were 55 and up.
- Most survey respondents (72%) were from the postal code area R2R where Finestone Park is located.
- 15 of 31 survey respondents visit the park monthly or more often.

September 2018

What We Heard

Existing parking issues surrounding the park (limited parking) should be taken into account when designing new amenities.

Open space for unstructured play is available at nearby parks, so maintaining space for that purpose in Finestone Park may not be necessary.

The top enhancement at the workshop was multi-age play equipment with 21 votes. Play equipment was identified by both workshop groups and 'play structure' was selected as a desired amenity by 16 of 30 survey respondents (1 respondent skipped this question).

27 of 30 (1 respondent skipped this question) survey respondents answered 'yes' when asked if they would like to see a walking path through the park. In addition, both groups at the workshop drew paths through the park.

Beach volleyball was the second rated enhancement at the workshop with 19 votes.

Current fencing was brought up as an accessibility issue and improved fencing was noted as a desired improvement in surveys and in the workshop.

18 of 30 (1 respondent skipped this question) survey respondents identified 'new trees planted' as a desired amenity. Trees were also included in proposed plans by both workshop groups.

A splashpad was suggested by a workshop group and received 12 votes. Five survey respondents indicated they would not like to see a splashpad added to the neighbourhood.

New benches and shaded canopy were identified by both workshop groups and benches were selected by 14 of 30 (1 respondent skipped this question) survey respondents.

Participants noted that community gardens may not be suited to this park, as most residences in the area are single family homes with yards, and many residents have gardens on their property.

Next Steps

The redevelopment of Finestone Park will be considered as part of the 2019 park redevelopment planning process. If the project is approved as part of the 2019 process, the park will be designed with consideration of the input provided from the public through the workshop and survey. Participants who requested updates will be contacted if the design moves forward.

Finestone Park Workshop Activities and Results

TASK 1: RECREATION OPTIONS IN AREA

Identify parks and recreational activities available in the area and recreational activities that are missing in the area.

Step 1: As a group, review the Task 1 map of adjacent parks and current recreational activities available in the area.

Step 2: Discuss which park areas and recreational activities are currently well used and why. Record the main points from the group discussion on the map use the markers provided.

Step 3: Discuss the recreational activities that are missing from the area or that are difficult to access. Record the main points from the group discussion on the map use the markers provided.

Consider the following:

- Which user groups should we be considering when developing new parks in this area?
- What amenities should commonly be available within a five to ten minute walking distance?
- Which area parks, if any, are overused in your mind?

Group 1 Notes:

- Splashpad/water feature would be beneficial
 - o Currently, there is one behind nearby Sobey's
 - This one is not very busy
 - o There is currently a wading pool near Tyndall Park School
 - o Only open until 5pm
- Daycare group goes to parks in the area, including Tyndall, Stanley and they charter buses to go to splashpads.
- Issues with maintenance community should commit to taking care of this park
- Currently the space is used as a cut-through
- Skate parks start at age 6 and could be useful for children
- Currently there are parking issues, how does that fit in with added amenities?
- The park should include something for children.
- Play structure at Tyndall Park is for older children and is too large for smaller children.
- A shelter would be required as this is an open area and it gets very hot.
- Pathway through the park should be asphalt.

Group 2 Notes:

- No splash pad or skate park needed in this area.
- There is not enough space for a skate park.
- An oven would not be appropriate for this space.
- Splash pad may be more appropriate in Walsall Park (also referred to as Manitoba Park).

TASK 2: PARK ENHANCEMENTS

Provide suggestions for new park enhancements, keeping in mind what is and isn't currently available in the area.

Instructions:

Step 1: As a group, open the Task 2 package and review the potential park enhancements.

Step 2: Place your group's preferred park enhancements on the map in the location where you would like them to appear. Add notes explaining your selections. When selecting park enhancements, consider the following:

- What currently is and isn't available in the area?
- What are current issues with the park and how could they be improved?

Step 3: Also provided is blank paper that can be cut into shapes. These can be used to add additional enhancements to the park that were not available in the package provided. Describe the enhancement on the back of the paper and place it on the map.

Step 4: Discuss why you have not placed some of the possible park enhancements on the map. Add notes on the back of these elements and place them back in the envelope.

Group 1 Notes (Task 2):

- Community gardens not relevant because individuals have backyards.
- Could include a bathroom that is open when the splashpad is open
- A portable toilet would be tipped, so it would have to be anchored.
- People spend one to two hours at the park so a bathroom may not be needed.
- Fence is currently wooden pillars with chain and this is not accessible.
 - A new fence should be accessible and could use bushes for the same function.
- Pavement should use a permeable material to reduce runoff.
- No need to include open space as open space is available at other nearby parks.
- Splashpad should be included.
- Trees and shade are needed.
- Would be beneficial to have multi-age equipment to accommodate all types of families.
- Parking is a challenge in this area (limited on-street).
- A splashpad may require additional parking.
 - o This should be a walkable park, rather than including parking.
 - o A secluded neighbourhood should not have amenities that require parking.
 - o Parking can cause a dangerous situation for young children.
- Additional lighting is required, as vandalism was an issue with the previous play structure and illuminating the area/structures may help to prevent vandalism.

Group 2 Notes (Task 2):

- Main entrance to the park is along the southwest corner, along Finestone Street.
- An entry feature should be constructed to signify the entrance to the park.
- Install some sort of short fencing along Finestone Street and along the lane at the south or southeast portion of the park in order to protect children who may otherwise run into the street.
- Install pathways that embrace current desire lines (that could be seen from the air photos).
- Common seating area with the potential for shade should be included.
- Lighting was brought up as a potential need, but was not seen as overly important to all, as some thought lighting may attract undesirable behaviour.



Step 1: As a group, select the top three enhancements from your Task 2 map and write them on the piece of paper provided.


Step 2: Walk around the room and review the other groups' top three enhancements and their maps.










